



2019 was a year of reflection for the Heroes Foundation, while at the same time, making a pivot toward the next decade of its efforts to advocate for the Hoosier cancer community.

We expressed our gratitude for the unwavering support of our friends, donors, sponsors and partners – many who have been by our side since the foundation's inception.

In its milestone twenty-fifth year, we celebrated the Catherine Peachey Fund's extraordinary impact on breast cancer research taking place in Indiana as their contributions exceeded the \$3 million mark.

We hosted a full calendar of successful, signature events – engaging and educating our constituents about the challenges facing cancer patients in Indiana and raising \$378,000 to support our ongoing mission to provide meaningful support to cancer patients, education to promote cancer prevention and resources to advance research for a cure.

With a desire to continue the momentum we have gained over the past nineteen years, we focused on the future of the organization and our strategic goals and objectives to maintain the health and impact of the foundation. We hired our first full-time executive director to guide our strategic goals and objectives into the next decade and beyond. We are excited about the enthusiasm around where the next decade will take the foundation.

As we are poised to celebrate twenty years, we acknowledge that while much has been accomplished, there is more work to be done. Cancer remains a tough adversary. In 2019, the Heroes Foundation continued its mission to advocate for the Indiana cancer community – taking stock of nineteen years of progress, while anticipating a major milestone on the horizon. This report revisits those nearly two decades of milestones and their impact on the foundation's commitment to support, prevention and research today and beyond.


2001 Founder Vince Todd, Jr receives a clean bill of health after treatment for Hodgkin's Lymphoma, signaling him and his wife Cindy, to start the Heroes Foundation. The first An Evening With Heroes Gala raised \$43,000 and the Todds received the WRTV-6 Leadership Award

A diagnosis of Hodgkin's Lymphoma in 2000 dramatically changed the course of things for newlyweds Vince and Cindy Todd. During his months of chemotherapy, Vince and Cindy believed that they were facing this battle for a reason. Part of that reason was to make an impact on the cancer community in Indiana.

With a clean bill of health and new sense of purpose, they rallied friends and family, launching the Heroes Foundation. With a small group of friends gathered around a dinner table, the idea of An Evening With Heroes Gala was formed, with the aim to raise funds to support Vince's fellow Hoosier cancer patients. The ambitious first event raised \$43,000 and helped set the course for the evolution of the Heroes Foundation. The Gala grew, relocated and grew again.

In January 2019, nearly 600 attendees converged on the JW Marriott in downtown Indianapolis to see keynote speaker Sean Swarner. A world record holder, adventurer, performance coach and author of, "Keep Climbing," Swarner shared his inspirational cancer survival story and the Gala raised over \$270,000 in net proceeds.







For the better part of 18 years, a natural extension of the Heroes Foundation has existed in Team Heroes. Rooted in the foundation's "summit" that promotes education to support cancer prevention, Team Heroes members compete at all levels of events sanctioned by USA Cycling, American Bicycle Racing, Cyclocross, and USA Triathlon throughout the Midwest and beyond. The team has been a vehicle to raise awareness about and actively engage in the Heroes Foundation's commitment to the battle against cancer.

In July 2019, the foundation held its signature Heroes Crit & Fit Day in Pendleton, IN. A competitive cycling event, partnered with a wellness festival, registered a record 300 cyclists from over twenty states across the country. The event reinforced that exercise is paramount in helping individuals prevent cancer, and the Fit Festival offered a plethora of resources included health screenings and general information about wellness and cancer prevention – tools to develop a blueprint for a healthy lifestyle.













2007 The SJP Heroes Cancer Research Fund is established in honor of Cindy Todd's mother, who fought cancer three times before losing her battle. The fund provides financial support to a clinical or research fellow or research project, in efforts to jumpstart promising projects.

Finding a cure for cancer remains the ultimate goal of researchers, and the Heroes Foundation is committed to providing resources to advance research toward that cure. In 2019, \$10,000 in grant funding was distributed to research endeavors in central Indiana. These projects represented in many cases, the nucleus of an idea or hunch that required funding for laboratory supplies, staffing, or seed money to leverage toward larger, national grants.

2011 Spin4Heroes a team-based, spin-cycling relay event is held for the first time. Over nine years, approximately \$500,000 has been raised to support the Heroes Foundation's mission.

In March 2019, the ninth edition of Spin4Heroes returned to the Indiana Farm Bureau Football Center on the campus of the Indianapolis Colts headquarters. Presented by Roche, 69 teams took to the practice field to raise funds to support the foundation's mission. Hundreds of spin participants, friends, family members, volunteers, sponsors and supporters came out to Indy's west side to experience this unique, high-energy event.









2012 When Joey, a pediatric cancer patient lost his well fought battle, those inspired by his story banded together to form the Team JOEY program. Since the program's inception, a special fund has been established to award grants for pediatric cancer research and LEGO sets have been provided to children receiving in-patient cancer treatment at local hospitals.

In 2019, Team JOEY volunteers worked in conjunction with Riley Hospital for Children, Peyton Manning Children's Hospital, and to host parties for residential pediatric patients and their families. A costumed character, pizza and LEGO sets were the stars of these events, offering patients with a much-needed departure from the rigors of cancer treatment. This year, the program exceeded the 3,000 mark in LEGO sets distributed to our littlest heroes. Additionally, \$30,000 was granted to fund pediatric cancer research at IU School of Medicine.











2013 The Heroes Foundation hosts its first #PIFF (Pay It Forward Friday) Party friend-raiser, serving up craft beer and important information about the fight against cancer. Over \$150,000 has been raised to support cancer advocacy since this annual event began.

A fall event in prior years, #PIFF was held in mid-May in 2019. Perfect weather greeted the annual outdoor gathering. Over 350 attendees enjoyed music and supported the mission of the foundation, featuring music by Los Angeles based band, The Dales.

2014 Project Militia, an initiative to help local citizens fight the war on cancer, is launched. "Hero1" is an iconic symbol of the battle cancer patients face in the wake of this disease, powering our education initiatives to prevent cancer.








2016 The Catherine Peachey Fund, promoting advances in breast cancer research and treatment in Indiana, joined forces with the Heroes Foundation. This new partnership helped magnify the significant impact funding for research has on finding a cure for breast cancer. Over its twenty-five-year history, the fund has awarded \$3.3 million in direct impact to breast cancer research-related projects in Indiana.

In 2019, a \$100,000 award was granted to fund two positions specializing in data analysis for the Catherine Peachey Fund Normal Breast Taxonomy Project and normal breast tissue research. The data will be made available to breast cancer researchers through the Komen Tissue Bank's Virtual Tissue Bank and will assist in organization of the system for data collected for any normal tissue samples within the Komen Tissue Bank.

The annual Wine Tasting With Peachey fundraising event was expanded to two dates and two locations in June 2019, setting records in attendance and dollars raised for the fund's mission.









2017 Heroes Foundation tees off Swing4Heroes, a competitive, fun pro-am golf tournament generating much needed funds to support the Indiana cancer community. In just three years, this sold out event has already raised \$200,000 to support the Indiana cancer community.

2019 marked the third year of the popular and sold-out Swing4Heroes fundraising event. Picture-perfect weather once again greeted the golfers, as each team paired with a golf professional for an afternoon on the beautiful course at Highland Golf & Country Club.





